

EN	<h2>Expensive housing: any solutions?</h2>
●	<p>The cost of living in Luxembourg is higher than in Brussels for newly recruited colleagues, who are usually those with lower incomes.</p>
●	<p>This difference is due to the cost of housing.</p>
●	<p>Given this, there are two possible reactions:</p>
①	<p>Either to turn to our employer (the European Communities) demanding an increase in our income ;</p>
②	<p>or to try to reduce, at the local level, the cost of housing or, at least, to be better informed on the structure of the market, so as to avoid pitfalls.</p>
●	<p>For many new colleagues, there is a third possibility: avoiding the problem by leaving Luxembourg; yet another topic for attracting votes for the 'politicians' of our micro-society...</p>
●	<p>The same 'politicians' are dangling fallacious pay demands, although they have been duly informed of the illusory, let alone risky, nature of such demands.</p>
